The Trust was set up in 1992 to provide a tax-deductible channel through which members and others could support the needy and distressed. Unlike most other agencies the Trust has no overheads, being run by volunteers and supported by the ACMA office. The Trust functions at arm's length to ACMA itself and is governed by an independent board.

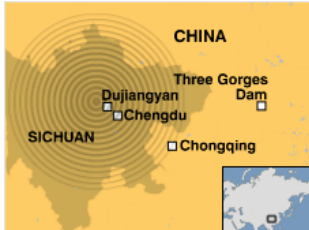
