

## **DRAFT ACMA Charitable Trust Annual Report 2009-2010**

### **1. PREAMBLE**

This is the second annual report presented by the present six trustees.

### **2. MEETINGS**

Six meetings were held in 2009-2010, on 30 September, 7 November, 25 November 2009, and 3 March, 12 May and 15 June 2010. Ms Margo-Lynne Lee took leave of absence of 6 months from mid March 2010.

### **3. GENERAL BUSINESS 2009/10**

In 2009/2010, ACMA members and their friends and families continued to generously support the fundraising activities of the ACMA Charitable Trust. A total of \$16,966 was raised for the Trust's charitable projects in this financial year.

Notably, Dr Ian Quek made a very generous personal donation of \$10,000, with \$5,000 specifically designated for the charitable activities of the ACMA Charitable Trust. In addition to over \$2,000 collected in June 2009, a further sum of \$4,786 was raised in July and August in sponsorships for the ACMA City2Surf team (led by Dr Stephen Hing and Dr George Han) who completed the 14 km Fun Run on 7 August 2009. All the runners/walkers worked very hard to solicit donations for the Trust. A good example is the hard work of Mrs Angela Tsui, wife of ACMA member Dr Peter Tsui, and a tireless behind-the-scene fundraiser for ACMA for many years. In addition to completing the City-to-surf walk, Angela was responsible for raising a sizeable part of the total amount achieved. As in previous years, ACMA's corporate sponsors, Castlereagh Imaging Group and Douglass Hanley Moire Pathology, donated very generously.

In this reporting period, the Trust was able to fulfil a pledge previously made by ACMA to donate a cardio-monitoring machine to the Du Jiang Yan People's Hospital in Sichuan, China following ACMA's successful 2007/2008 China Earthquake Appeal.

With the assistance of Dr Stephen Li, Executive Committee member of ACMA, and Ms Helen Shen, contact was re-established with the target hospital, the much needed equipment identified, purchased, and installed. A sum of \$16,956.46 (the equivalent of 100,000 RMB) was remitted to the supplier in December 2009 thus completing this project.

Further to this disbursement, the Trust made donations to support the charitable and community education activities of CanRevive and Chinese Parents Association – Children with Disabilities Inc. It also donated \$2,000 to the Australian Nursing Home Foundation in response to its appeal for donations for the building of a new Aged Care facility for the Chinese speaking community.

### **4. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS**

Establishment of the present trustees as authorized signatories of the existing Trust account at NAB were completed in December 2009. With the operation of a new account at St George Bank, the old bank account at NAB was closed in May 2010.

With the assistance provided by Margo-Lynn Lee and Dr Leslie Lim the 2009/2010 editor of the ACMA Newsletter, the ACMA Charitable Trust established a regular column in the ACMA Newsletter. Dr Leslie Lim is also the ACMA's Website administrator. Again with his generous assistance, the ACMA Charitable Trust website has been totally revamped and updated. The ACMA Charitable Trust section of the ACMA web page now contains the Trustees' profiles, and a recount of the Trust's charitable projects. This website will be updated regularly, and the Trust wishes to express its thanks to Dr Leslie Lim for his help.

As in previous year, the Trust also wishes to thank Ms Anita Wong, Hon Auditor, for enabling the Trust to complete its financial report for this year. The Trust also wishes to express its appreciation and thanks to Beatrice and Dorothy at the ACMA Office for their help and assistance.
