The Annual Scientific Conference, to be held in Bowral in October, was postponed from last year and is now all set to go ahead. The rooms we had booked at Milton Park have all been, reserved for members from

Other changes may be necessary to meeting and voting regulations, in light of the Covid 19 Pandemic. The MC also wants to consider how to get medical students involved with ACMA.

I am pleased to report that due to the voluntary hours put in by MC members, we have been able to limit spending on administration. The Association's financial outlook is much brighter than two years ago. The ACMA Charitable Trust, under the chair of Ms Linda Tang, is currently fundraising to support the ANHF Aged Care facility currently under construction at Gordon. The Welcome Lounge will be named for ACMA. All people who visit the facility will pass through this area. It will be great publicity for ACMA and will be a great asset for the facility. Most of the residents will be government funded, and will be pleased to have a culturally welcoming

The Trust is also fundraising to establish a scholarship for a medical student at Western Sydney University. The student will be the first in a low income family, to study at a tertiary level.


Q: What one piece of financial advice would you give to a young medical graduate?


